Important Dates

March 1st: Registration materials go home- Cohort A. All materials available online via Canvas (homeroom).

March 4th: Registration materials go home- Cohort B

March 8/9: Course registration with 8th grade

counselors- Cohort A

March 11/12: Course registration with 8th grade

counselors- Cohort B

March 8-12: Virtual students select classes online.

How many classes do I choose?

Every 8th grade student will choose a total of 9 classes (core classes + electives + alternates). H/PE is already selected for you as a 10th class. You will be scheduled for 4 classes each semester.

What is an "alternate"?

Every student must select 2 alternate electives. The computer will use your alternate choices if your 1st choice electives are at capacity or don't fit in your schedule.

Honors vs. Standard Courses. What's the difference?

Classes that are honors level have an "H" or "Honors" in the course title. Honors classes are intended to be college preparatory, so they are more challenging that standard level classes. If you are currently making 90% or higher in your current classes and have a strong work ethic, consider taking honors level courses. If you aren't quite ready for honors-level classes right now, you can always wait and take them in the 10th grade.

Student Athletes...your credits matter!

To be eligible for athletics, you must earn a minimum of 3 credits during the semester that precedes your sport's season. To remain eligible during the season, you must be enrolled in a minimum of 2 classes. Early Out/Late Arrival is not a class or a credit!

Remember, absences & promotion also affect your eligibility.
